Family Fun Tip

The end of the school year is coming up. Here's a great gift idea for your kid's teacher.

Make a class cookbook.

Use an 8 x 8 top loading scrapbook. Give each student a piece of scrapbook paper and ask them to write down a family recipe on one side and a thank you note on the other side. Some parents might want to actually type up a recipe the teacher can actually use, or the kids can write their own or even draw one.

After collecting all the recipes, slide them into the scrapbook. You can fill any blank spots with photos from class activities.

For a final touch, add a bookmark made from a ribbon and adorned with cooking-themed charms. You can even attach a gift card to a grocery story.
